SUBCOMMITTEE ACTION

The Committee on Homeland Security's Subcommittee on Emergency Communications, Preparedness, and Response met, pursuant to notice, a quorum being present, in open markup session, on Tuesday, November 3, 2009, in 311 Cannon House Office Building to consider the following measures H.R. 3837, to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to provide for clarification on the use of funds relating to certain homeland security grants, and for other purposes.; H.R. 3978, to amend the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to accept and use gifts for authorized purposes, including first responder terrorism preparedness training, and for other purposes.; and H.R. 3980, to provide for identifying and eliminating redundant reporting requirements and developing meaningful performance metrics for homeland security preparedness grants, and for other purposes. The Subcommittee took the following actions:

H.R. 3837, to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to provide for clarification on the use of funds relating to certain homeland security grants, and for other purposes.; was ordered to be forwarded to the Full Committee for consideration with the recommendation that it be adopted, by voice vote.

The Committee adopted the measure, without amendment, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3978, to amend the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to accept and use gifts for authorized purposes, including first responder terrorism preparedness training, and for other purposes.; was ordered to be forwarded to the Full Committee for consideration with the recommendation that it be adopted, by voice vote.

The Committee adopted the measure, without amendment, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3980, to provide for identifying and eliminating redundant reporting requirements and developing meaningful performance metrics for homeland security preparedness grants, and for other purposes; was ordered to be forwarded to the Full Committee for consideration with the recommendation that it be adopted, by voice vote.

The Committee adopted the measure, without amendment, by unanimous consent.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. Cuellar to adopt H.R. 3837, H.R. 3978, and H.R. 3980, each without amendment; was not objected to.
